## Naval Station welcomes new commanding officer

Sailors at Naval Station Guantanamo Bay, Cuba upheld time-honored naval tradition during a Change of Command ceremony Sept. 23 at the Windjammer Ballroom.

More than 300 Sailors, Soldiers, Marines, Airmen, Coast Guardsmen and civilians bid a formal farewell to Navy Capt. Steven Blaisdell and welcomed the base's new commander, Navy Capt. Kirk Hibbert.

During the ceremony, Rear Adm. Townsend "Tim" Alexander spoke about Blaisdell's two-year tour as Guantanamo's commander.

"For the last two years, there has been no doubt that Steve Blaisdell has been in charge," said Alexander. "He has maintained an unrelenting focus on the things that matter: our Navy, our Sailors, and their families."

During his tour, Blaisdell completed \$66

million in construction projects to improve Guantanamo residents' quality of life, including new athletic facilities, new base housing, perimeter road upgrades, new runway lights and the recent renovation of the Windjammer facility. Blaisdell also oversaw the launch of a new energy policy.

Additionally, Blaisdell and his Sailors at Guantanamo Bay received numerous awards, including the 2009 Navy Exchange Service Command Bingham Award, three consecutive CNIC Retention Honor Roll awards, the 2009 Captain Edward F. Ney Award for Excellence in Food Service, the 2009 Professional Housing Management Association's Outstanding Housing Installation Team award, and two Real Estate Government Housing Awards.

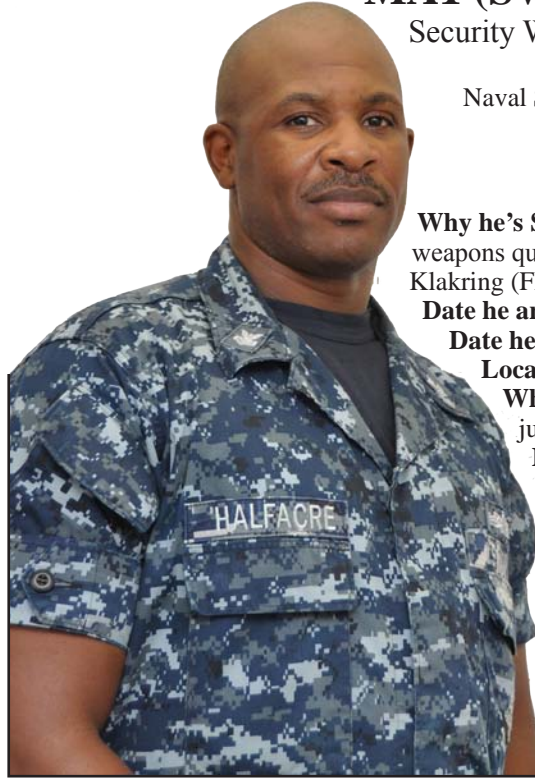

## Waste to Energy Converter could save us big bucks

**B**eginning this month, a Waste Oil to Energy Converter (WOTEC) began operation at the Naval Station's Power Plant.

WOTEC takes used oil and filters it with six-micron filters. The filtered, used oil is blended with diesel fuel at ratios of 0.5 to five percent. The lower ratio is used for diesel engines and the higher ratios are for boilers. The blended product is filtered again with three-micron filters before being pumped to the generator. Diesel fuel we purchase for our cars is typically filtered down to 10-microns.

The WOTEC concept is not new and is currently in use in Iraq to re-use oil from Humvees and other equipment.

Guantanamo Bay's Public Works Department (PWD) installed the WOTEC to reduce and possibly eliminate all associated disposal costs for used oil generated by the power plant, and to turn a waste into a useful product.

Annually, the power plant generates about 17,000 gallons of used oil. Used oil is shipped off-base as a bulk hazardous waste at a disposal cost of a cost of \$0.70 per pound or about \$5.25 per gallon.

In addition, each sea container used for transportation off-base costs \$4,000 and transports up to 4,500 gallons.

The annual cost last year to containerize, manifest and ship 17,000 gallons to Blount Island, Fla., was more than \$104,450. The used oil would be hauled away by a Florida

licensed used oil recycler.

The reason used oil can be used in engines and boilers is that it has similar energy content (BTU) as diesel fuel.

When the new fiscal year begins Oct. 1, diesel prices will increase from \$2.33 to \$3.02. By using WOTEC, the 17,000 gallons of used oil will be substituted for

diesel fuel and produce an annual savings of \$51,340. Total annual savings for re-use of Power Plant No.4 used oil is projected to be \$155,790.

Approximately 125 gallons of oil per day is currently being processed and used as fuel for the power-generating diesel engines.

PWD's goal initially is to blend all used oil generated by Power Plant No.4 and verify that there are no negative effects to the diesel engines.

At the 125 gallon rate, Power Plant No.4 produces enough used oil for 15 weeks, which means other sources on the base can be used for the remaining 37 weeks.

Annual savings to the Navy will be \$110,000 if WOTEC can process PWD Transportation's estimated 12,000 gallons of used oil.

Eventually, PWD hopes to treat all oil recovered from ships' bilge water; however, this recovered oil from bilge water contains a significant amount of water that is detrimental to diesel engines.

Further treatment of the recovered oil from bilge water may be required to meet the stringent no-water requirements.

If the recovered oil from bilge water can be processed, the Navy will save an additional \$256,360 per year.

The initial investment of the unit and installation at the power plant was approximately \$106,650. Including annual contractor operating costs, the Naval Station will have a return on investment in less than one year.

and a superb leader,” said Alexander.

Alexander said Blaisdell also played a vital role in Operation Unified Response, when the U.S. military needed a logistical hub for continued relief efforts in Haiti.

“Under his leadership, GTMO quickly became the beginning of a lifeline for thousands of Haitians, a central hub for tons of water and food, medical teams, rescue teams, and much more,” said Alexander. “Through decisive action, tactical knowledge and hard work, Steve played a key role in setting the wheels of restoration in motion, and saved many lives in the process.”

Alexander said he knew Hibbert would continue Blaisdell’s efforts on furthering the base’s accomplishments.

Hibbert came to Guantanamo from Commander, U.S. Northern Command, where he was the Chief for Plans and Orders.

During the ceremony, Hibbert said he knows he and all other Sailors at Guantanamo Bay will work together toward a common goal.

“That goal was bestowed upon us by the American people,” said Hibbert. “And the bottom line is that we are here to protect and safe-guard our young men and women.”

Hibbert also credited his mother, late father, wife and two daughters with his success and assumed command of Naval Station Guantanamo Bay, Cuba.

Naval Station Guantanamo Bay, Cuba is a 45 square-mile base located in the Oriente Province of Cuba. The land was leased from Cuba in 1903, and to date, the U.S. government sends \$4,085 treasury dollars to the Cuban government per month for the land.

In 1961, the U.S. and Cuba severed diplomatic relations. For almost 50 years, the base has been responsible for making its own energy and water resources. It is the only 100 percent self-sufficient base in a different country.

The Naval Station is also the only base in a Communist country and the only base in a country with which the U.S. does not have diplomatic relations.

The base supported Fleet Training Group through 1943 through 1995 and Shore Intermediate Maintenance Activity from 1903 through 1995.

In the mid-1990s, the base has safely housed more than 45,000 migrants at once and aided migrant operations officials with repatriation efforts.

In 2001, the base supported the establishment of Joint Task Force Guantanamo and continues to support its detainee mission.

In January, Guantanamo served as the logistical hub for Operation Unified Response with disaster relief efforts and humanitarian assistance for Haiti after a 7.0-magnitude earthquake struck near the Haitian capitol.

### GTMO Wildlife Regulations

NAVSTAGTMOINST 1710.1A —Outdoor Recreation and Wildlife Instruction states that the use of parks, beaches and waters in and around Guantanamo Bay, Cuba, is a privilege that carries an inherent responsibility to preserve the fragile ecological balance of these areas. Therefore, the “taking” of any animal, fish, or plant—or any part thereof—is prohibited. (“Take” means to intentionally harm, kill, harass or remove from the natural habitat.) Beaches, parks and facilities are available for the enjoyment of all personnel. Be courteous and respectful of the rights of others...including the wild life.

### It's Conch Season!

Remember the “take” requirements for Queen (pink) Conchs: Immature open Queen Conchs, or “rollers,” are subject to NAVSTAGTMOINST 1710.1A regulations. Only one live shell per person per day. The shell must be over 9 inches in length or the thinnest part of the lip must be at least one-eighth of an inch thick.

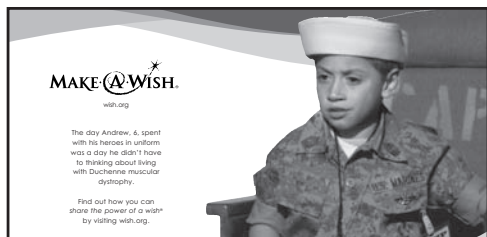
